



FATHER & SON BASEBALL TOURNAMENT

JUNE 19 – 20 @ GODWIN STADIUM, WILMINGTON, NC

FAQ'S (Frequently Asked Questions) This section will be updated periodically as we address inquiries from interested parties.

- **Is this tournament for the benefit of a charity?**

Yes, the CMBL will donate the net proceeds and any other donations to the Wounded Warrior Project. The purpose of the Wounded Warrior Project is to raise awareness and enlist the public's aid for the needs of severely injured service men and women, to help severely injured service members aid and assist each other, and to provide unique, direct programs and services to meet the needs of severely injured service members.



- **How many games will each team play?**

Each team will play at least two games – one on Saturday and one on Sunday. There may be a Championship game depending on the number of teams that participate.

- **How much does it cost per player to participate?**

The fee for CMBL players is \$50 each for father and/or son. The fee for players who are not members of the CMBL, or sons or fathers of CMBL players, is \$60 per player.

- **What does the registration fee cover?**

Registration fee includes a **FREE** CMBL commemorative uniform shirt, team liability insurance, baseballs, fields, umpires, 2 guaranteed games, team champion awards.

- **Can any family member join a team, not just a son?**

No, this is a Father & Son tournament.

However, for those Fathers or Sons whose Father or Son is unavailable, there is an "adoption" option. A player who is 35+ can "adopt" a Son, provided that there is at least a twenty (20) year difference between the "Father" and the "Son". Limit to 2 "Adopted Sons" per team.

- **Is a son-in-law considered a "Son"?**

Yes, a Father may be paired with his son-in-law and play on the same team as Father and Son.

- **May a Son adopt a “Father”?**

Yes, Sons may adopt “Fathers” provided there is at least a twenty (20) year age difference between the “Son” and the “Father.” There is no limit per team to the number of “Fathers” that may be adopted.

- **How many players constitute a team?**

A team is comprised of at least 16 players and there is no maximum limit.

- **How many “Fathers” must be on a team roster?**

There is no set number, but managers should be cognizant of the Tournament participation rules and plan to have a sufficient number of “Fathers” to satisfy the rules, especially as they pertain to pitching.

- **When rosters are submitted or formed must “Fathers” be designated as such?**

Yes. For those teams formed by the CMBL Tournament Director, he will be mindful of this requirement when setting up the teams.
